### The problems of using mobile phones while abroad

It is a modern day horror story. You go abroad on holiday or on a business trip with your mobile phone. While you are there you call your family back home, you check up what your friends are doing on your social networking site, you go online to see how your local football team is getting on and then you come back and you get "the bill". There's even a name for it "bill shock".

It certainly happened to the BBC reporter Fiona Foster. Last month she was working in Russia and she decided to send her little girls a few texts and some photos to accompany them. When she got home there was a phone bill waiting for her for over \$4,000. One German traveler faced a bill of \$56,436 for downloading a film while in France.

That's why two years ago European regulators cracked down on what they call "the mobile rip off" by setting a limit on roaming costs within the European Union despite strong objections from several big phone companies who claimed the regulation was anticompetitive.

From July 1<sup>st</sup> this year those maximum charges will be reduced to 39 eurocents a minute for making a call and 15 eurocents a minute for receiving one. It'll cost no more than 11 cents to send a text. There will also be a cut off mechanism when you spend 50 euros, unless you stipulate your own limit, and the phone company will be obliged to warn you when your bill hits 80% of that limit. But when you take your mobile phone outside the EU borders those regulations no longer apply. That is when things can get very confusing not to mention expensive.

If you're an Indian visiting the US for example, you might be paying over \$5 a minute to call home, whereas an American on holiday in India could be paying under \$2 a minute.

Consumers are lobbying for EU regulations to be introduced around the world. But until that happens the best advice is to do some research before you travel.

Phone your network operator. They have all the information about the charges across the world. Ask yourself if you really need to make a phone call while you are away. Find out where you are going, change the SIM card (the small removable chip inside your handset) in your mobile phone for a local SIM card, find out if your hotel has wi fi and ask your network to switch off your voicemail service before you leave the UK to avoid extra charges.

Glossary: Roaming: use of a cellular phone outside its calling area.

Rip-off: Something extremely expensive.
