1.-The final sounds for regular verbs in the past are /t/, /d/, and /id/.

2. The final sound is pronounced /t/ after the endings s, ss, sh, ch, x, p, k, se, ce, ge, ze, gh, ph

3. The final sound is pronounced /d/ after the voiced sounds /b/, /g/, /ge/, /l/, /m/, /n/, /r/, /ng/, /z/, /v/, and /z/.

tied	argued
snowed	combed

4. The final sound is pronounced /d/ after vowel sounds.

played
skied

5. The final sound is pronounced /id/ after /t/ and /d/, /id/ adds a syllable.
