the place where a judge decides whether someone is guilty of a crime

a public officer authorized to hear and decide cases in a court of law

A person who secretly gains access to computers and files without permission.

someone who may have committed a crime

when the police take someone away to ask them about a crime which they might have committed

to give a punishment to someone who has committed a crime

a formal police statement that a person has committed a crime
