2nd CONDITIONAL

If + past simple, WOULD + bare infinitive

If I studied, I would pass the exam.

3rd CONDITIONAL

If + past perfect, WOULD + have + past participle

If I had studied, I would have passed the exam.

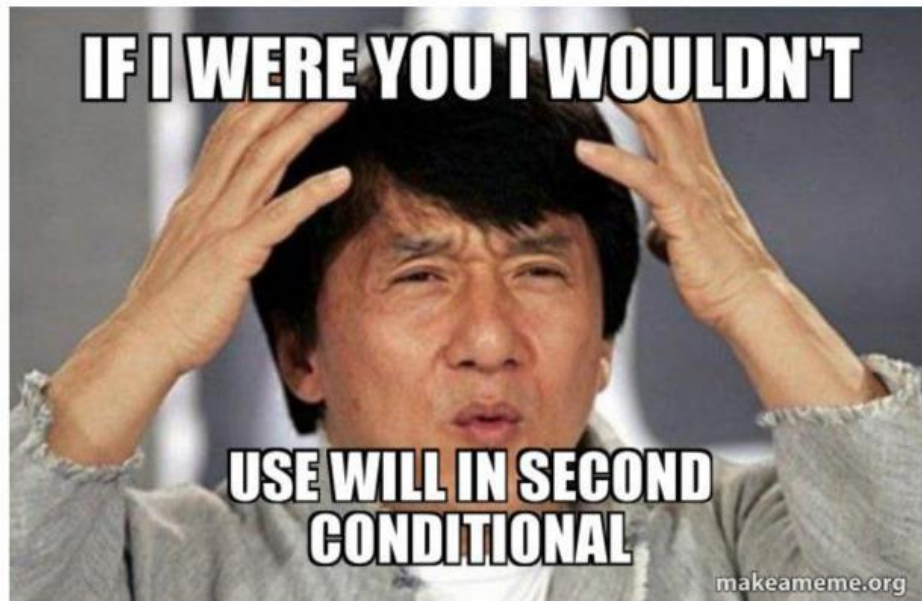

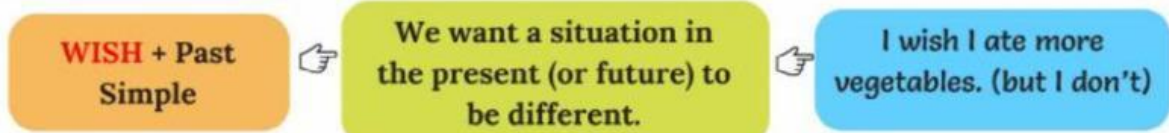
