No, I haven't. = No, I have not.

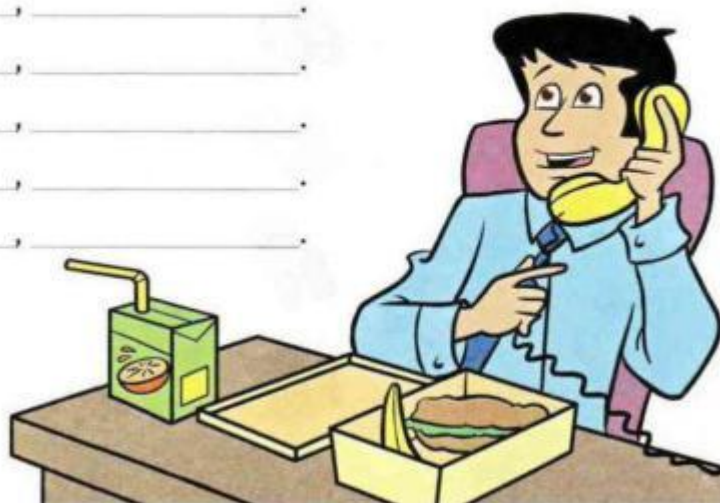
