## EXERCISE 178 – STATEMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Change these statements into questions.

e.g. John **was** absent yesterday.  
Was John absent yesterday?

1. He **was** playing in the rain. **Was he playing in the rain?**
2. Wai Fong **is** beautiful. **Is Wai Fong beautiful?**
3. They **are** very rich. **Are they very rich?**
4. She **has** a doll. **Has she a doll?**
5. It **is** barking now. **Is it barking now?**
6. They **have** finished it. **Have they finished it?**
7. They **were** singing in the hall.
8. It **was** Chong Meng's bag.
9. I **am** very late.
10. The girls **were** picking flowers.

## EXERCISE 179 – STATEMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Change the following negative sentences into questions using the written form
