1 Read the article about an unusual prison.

Prisoners in paradise

There are many reasons for tourists to visit the tropical islands of the Philippines: stunning beaches, some of world's finest diving spots, extraordinary geological features such as the Chocolate Hills and the Puerto Princesa Subterranean River National Park. **1** Iwahig Prison and Penal Farm is one of the world's largest open prisons and, strange as it sounds, it welcomes thousands of tourists every year.

The prison stands on around 340 km² of land covered with forest and bordered by mountains. There are no high walls to keep the prisoners locked inside, just a ditch which is not guarded. **2** A small part of the land is used for growing rice, and coconut tree groves, corn fields and other vegetable plots have been created here and there. Animals such as goats and cows wander around, while ducks, white egrets and other water birds feed in the rice fields.

The prisoners are sent here to learn and to earn. All but the most dangerous of them are given training in skills such as farming and fishing. These activities provide an income for the prison authorities, helping to pay the costs of running the prison. **3** The aim of this unusual prison is to give the prisoners the experience of being part of a community and a chance at building a successful life for themselves when they are released.

Not all prisoners here have equal levels of freedom. There are about 200 minimum security prisoners who are allowed to live in their own straw-and-bamboo huts around the

prison grounds, and even bring their families to live there.

4 These prisoners work the fields in large groups watched by just a few prison guards, who can often be seen resting under trees while the prisoners work with sharp metal tools. At night, they sleep together in large buildings with plenty of space. Only the 150 maximum security prisoners must work indoors and are locked up and isolated overnight.

Iwahig welcomes tourists who are curious to see this unique prison. At its ceremonial gate, one guard sits as people walk past him often without being checked. **5** This is surprising enough, but also prisoners don't look anything like the typical image of a prisoner. They are wearing loose T-shirts and caps they have chosen themselves specially for the show. The tourists donate a little money to the performers and may spend more in the gift shop, where the souvenirs have been crafted by the prisoners themselves.

Tourists don't just come for these novelties though. Their visit is an opportunity to see how the prisoners live in the prison and talk to them. The prisoners share their food with tourists as if they are their guests and chat about life in the prison. **6** One reason is that, compared to the conditions that prisoners live in in other prisons in the Philippines, life is very good here. Perhaps, though, the main thing that keeps them here is the chance of a new kind of life on their release. Fewer than 10% of the prisoners at Iwahig will commit another crime when they leave.
