Coca-Cola is a popular drink for people all over the world. At first, very few people drank Coca-Cola, but now it is sold in more than 160 countries. More than 1.6 billion gallons are sold every year.

Coca-Cola was invented by Dr. John Pemberton in Atlanta on 8 May 1886. However, the name Coca-Cola was given by Frank Robinson, one of Dr. Pemberton's partners. In Italy, breakfast is typically served in the early morning hours and is a light meal consisting of coffee, pastry, or fruit. A (36) staple at breakfast is a brioche, a type of croissant that can be filled with jam, custard, or even decadent chocolate.

Lunch is a heartier meal compared to breakfast, the first course consists (37) either rice or pasta, and the second course offers either a kind of meat or fish as well as a side of vegetables or a salad. For dessert, cake, ice cream, or fresh fruit is served along with a cup of espresso or coffee. A light snack late in the afternoon is reserved for children which consists of something sweet (38) bread, fruit, or ice cream.
