He is happy.

I	am	I'm	I am not	I'm not
 You	are	You're	You are not not	You're not You aren't
He/she/it 	is	He's She's He's	He is not She is not It is not	He's not / He isn't She's not / She isn't It's not / It isn't

Plural personal pronouns

Pronoun	Positive	Contraction	Negative	Contractions
We	are	We're	We are not	We're not We aren't
You	are	You're	You are not	You're not You aren't
They	are	They're	They are not	They're not They aren't

VERB TO BE SUBJECT COMPLEMENT

Are you OK?

Is he in the library?

Am I in English class?

★ Short positive answers

VERB TO BE	SUBJECT	COMPLEMENT
Yes,	I	am
No,	he	is not
Yes,	you	are

Affirmative	Negative	(Verb contracted)	(not contracted)
Yes, I am.	No, I am not.	No, I'm not.	No, I amn't.
Yes, you are.	No, you are not.	No, you're not.	No, you aren't.
Yes, we are.	No, we are not.	No, we're not.	No, we aren't.
Yes, they are.	No, they are not.	No, they're not.	No, they aren't.
Yes, he is.	No, he is not.	No, he's not.	No, he isn't.
Yes, she is.	No, she is not.	No, she's not.	No, she isn't.
Yes, it is.	No, it is not.	No, it's not.	No, it isn't.
