5th grade level

Exploring Landmarks in the United States of America

Objective:

Students will be able to identify and describe significant landmarks in the United States of America.

Assessment:

Students will create a travel brochure highlighting three different U.S. landmarks, including descriptions and interesting facts about each.

Key Points:

- Understanding the definition of a landmark
- Identifying key landmarks in the United States
- Describing the historical and cultural significance of each landmark

Opening:

- Show students an image of a well-known U.S. landmark and ask them to write down what they already know about it.
- Discuss with students why landmarks are important and what they can teach us about a place.

Introduction to New Material:

- Define what a landmark is and provide examples from around the world.
- Introduce specific U.S. landmarks such as the Statue of Liberty, the Grand Canyon, and Mount Rushmore.
- Common misconception: All landmarks are natural features - clarify that some are man-made structures.

Guided Practice:

- Engage students in a discussion about the landmarks introduced.
- Show images and provide brief descriptions of each landmark for students to analyze.
- Ask scaffolded questions starting from basic identification to more detailed historical and cultural inquiries.
- Monitor student responses and provide feedback to ensure understanding.

Independent Practice:

- Provide students with a list of additional U.S. landmarks to research and write short descriptions for.

- Students will create a travel brochure featuring three U.S. landmarks of their choice with descriptions and fun facts.
- Encourage creativity and colorful visuals in their brochures.

Closing:

- Have students present their travel brochures to the class, highlighting each landmark they chose and what makes it significant.
- Summarize the main points learned about U.S. landmarks during the lesson.

Extension Activity:

- For early finishers, challenge them to create a poster comparing and contrasting two different U.S. landmarks in terms of history, size, and popularity.

Homework:

- As homework, students can research a U.S. landmark of their choice and prepare a short oral presentation to share with the class the following day.
