Recordemos que para tercera persona singular (**he, she, it**) se le agrega la **"S"** al verbo en una oración afirmativa.

EXAMPLES:

1. I go to the cinema----**She goes** to the cinema
2. You have an Iphone-----**He has** an Iphone.
3. They do their homework-----**She does** her homework.
