<u>Subject Pronouns</u>		
	<u>Singular</u>	<u>Plural</u>
1st Person	I	we
2nd Person	you	you
3rd Person	he, she, it	they

Recordemos que para tercera persona singular (**he, she, it**) se le agrega la “**S**” al verbo en una oración afirmativa.

### EXAMPLES:

1. I go to the cinema----**She goes** to the cinema
2. You have an Iphone----**He has** an Iphone.
3. They do their homework----**She does** her homework.

### 1. Choose the correct verb.

Roger likes/like baseball. He is a pitcher. A pitcher tries/try the other team doesn't/don't bat effectively. Roger plays/play baseball every Friday. His training start/starts at six o'clock. Para oraciones negativas en tercera persona singular (**he, she, it**) va acompañada del “**doesn't**” y para **I, we, you, they** se usa el “**don't**” y luego va en el verbo infinitivo (sin agregar “S”)

### 3. Order the interrogative sentence

Para oraciones interrogativas usamos el verbo auxiliar **do / does**: para **I, you, we, they** se usa el “**do**” + verbo en infinitivo (sin agregar “S”) y para **she, he, it** se usa el “**does**” + verbo en infinitivo(sin agregar “S”)
