If- clause	Main clause
If it doesn't stop soon,	it may destroy our oceans forever.
Unless we do something to reduce the waste,	by 2050 there could be more plastic in the sea than fish.
If we collect all the plastic,	we might be able to protect our oceans.
Main clause	If- clause
We'll destroy our beautiful oceans	if we don't do something now.
