- THE WORDS THAT YOU HEAR AND READ IN THE FIRST LIST WILL ALWAYS BE THE SAME. YOU'LL HEAR THE FIRST LIST IN THE SAME ORDER AS YOU READ IT. IN THE SECOND LIST, THE WORDS YOU HEAR ARE SOMETIMES THE SAME AS THE WORDS YOU READ.
