Activism is the effort to try to change a social, economic or politic problem. Activism can be expressed in many ways such as: letters, hunger strikes, art, marches, and social media. Activism can be divided into three types:

- 1. Environmental activism:** Environmental activists fight to stop green areas from being sold, and are against the pollution of the environment.
- 2. Internet activism:** The internet has been used by activists since 1998 to promote their beliefs. It's been an important tool in many situations, like when people in the Middle East and North Africa used social media to protest against the revolutions happening in their countries.
- 3. Design activism:** Design activism creates products that can be useful for starting conversations about important subjects. For example; in Tokyo, an art exhibition talks about the problems of war, climate change, and social problems.

Some important activists have been:

- 1. Mahatma Gandhi:** Protested peacefully for the independence of India from Britain.
- 2. Thomas Jefferson:** Protested against slavery, even though he owned slaves.
- 3. Christine de Pizan:** Was a female author that protested against sexism with her writing, and is thought to be one of the first feminists.
