What's the difference?

advise

(verb)

to give an opinion or suggestion to someone about what should be done

correct: **I don't know what to do. Please advise me.**

incorrect: **I have a problem and need some advise.**

(noun)

an opinion or suggestion about what someone should do

correct: **Sam had a problem, so I gave him advice.**

incorrect: **The father always advises his children.**



Dear Anita,


