- (c) To show actions that have happened in the past at an unspecified time, usually with words like *before, ever* or *finally*.
- (d) To show actions that are repeated or habitual.
- (e) To show unfinished time (*today, this week, this month, etc.*)


1.4 Present Perfect Continuous

(c) Emphasises the duration or 'how long' with <i>since</i> or <i>for</i>	Dorai has been working for the company for the past ten years.
