 - /ɪz/ with verbs ending in /s/, /ʃ/, /tʃ/, /dʒ/ or /z/ sounds (e.g. *brushes, watches, exercises*)

Examples:

/z/ shows, tries, draws, begins, stays

/ɪz/ matches, rises, washes, misses, arranges
