Modal Verb	Degree of Possibility	Context	Clues/Indicators	Example Sentence
<b>May</b>	Moderate	Formal or Evidence-based	Some evidence or expectation	According to the forecast, it may rain tomorrow.
<b>Might</b>	Low	Informal or Tentative	Less certain, more tentative	It might rain tomorrow, but the sky is clear right now.
<b>Could</b>	General	Hypothetical or Conditional	Range of possibilities, conditions	If she finishes her work early, she could go to the party.

Modal Verb	Usage	Example Sentence	Explanation
<b>Must</b>	Strong possibility or high probability	"She must be at work; her car is not in the driveway."	Indicates that the speaker believes something is very likely to be true based on available evidence.
<b>Can't</b>	Strong impossibility or high improbability	"He can't be the culprit; he was with me all night."	Indicates that the speaker believes something is very unlikely or impossible to be true based on evidence.
