Adverbs of Time

An adverb of Time tells us about the time of action.

These adverbs answer the question 'when?'

These includes words such as tomorrow, today, yesterday, now, then, never, soon, already, ago, immediately, formerly, lately etc.

Examples:

1. The milkman comes to our house daily.
2. She wakes up early.
3. Ria will come tomorrow.
