- 5) "I are doing my homework." Is a correct sentence in present continuous.
- 6) An interrogative sentence in present continuous has the same structure than an affirmative and a negative sentence.
- 7) To create a sentence in present continuous, I always need to have the verbs "am/is/are".
- 8) "They do their homework." Is a correct sentence in present continuous.
- 9) "Am I going to school?" is a negative sentence in present continuous.
- 10) "Is Juan studying for his exams?" Is incorrect and cannot be considered as an interrogative sentence.
- 11) "She isn't a good student." Is a correct negative sentence in present continuous.
- 12) "My brother is playing the piano." Is a correct sentence in present continuous.
- 13) When making an interrogative sentence in present continuous, I must use "am/is/are" before the subject.

14) "Mike isn't feeling well, he is feeling sick." Is a correct positive sentence in present continuous.

15) "Louis is learning how to play guitar." Is incorrect and doesn't have a verb to be.

16) "studing." Is written correctly.

17) The verb run in present continuous is "running".

18) The verb "Shopping" is correct in present continuous.
