

Suffixes -er, -or, -ist

- A suffix is a word part that is added to the end of a root word.
- A suffix changes the meaning of a word.
- Some suffixes have the same meaning.

The suffixes -er, -or, -ist mean *one who*

the one who won → *winner*

the one who acts → *actor*

the one who bicycles → *bicyclist*
