Octopuses



- Example** An octopus is a creature which lives in the sea. It has a round head with two large eyes. People often think that
- 1 octopuses have eight legs, but they have
 - 2 four pairs of arms. Octopuses live in oceans all
 - the world. Octopuses that live in warm water are small, and
 - 3 that live in cold water are much
 - 4 Most octopuses are 'nocturnal'. This means
 - 5 that they sleep day, and move around and eat at
 - 6 night. Octopuses usually live one or two years.
 - To move, octopuses usually use their arms to walk
 - 7 the bottom of the sea. When they
 - need to, they can swim at forty kilometres an hour for a short
 - 8 time. an octopus needs to hide from
 - 9 creatures, it can change colour. It can also
 - get into very small spaces because its body is very soft.
 - 10 Octopuses are very clever. For example, they can
 - new things and open bottles. Octopuses can see very well with their
 - large eyes, but they can't hear anything.

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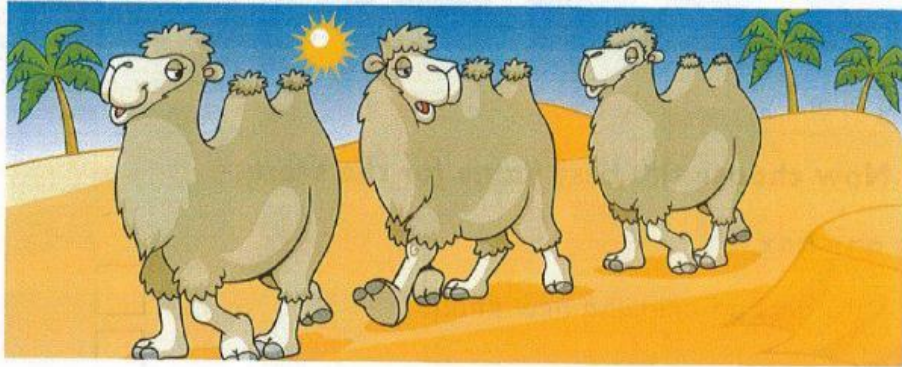
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Camels

- camels can travel 45 kilometres in one hour.

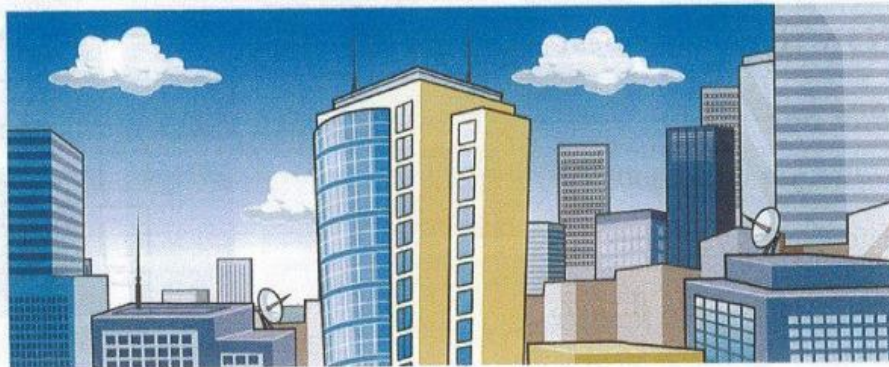

Many large cities in the world have skyscrapers. In the past, a 'skyscraper' was a kind of high sail on a sailing ship. But today the word 'skyscraper' means a very

- 1 building. Some people think that a building
 - 2 can only be a skyscraper when it has more
 - 3 than 50 floors, but others do agree.
 - 4 A long time , buildings were usually only
 - 5 five or six floors high. Then, in 1852, Elisha Otis, a mechanic,
 - 6 invented a lift was safe and could carry
 - 7 passengers up and down many floors. At the same time, engineers were
 - 8 stronger and lighter kinds of metal. With these
 - 9 lifts and metals, engineers could very high
 - 10 skyscrapers for people to live and work in.
