_____ Mountains are the longest continental mountain range in the world, forming a continuous highland along the western edge of South America. The range is 8,900 km (5,530 mi) long and 200 to 700 km (124 to 435 mi) wide (widest between 18°S and 20°S latitude) and has an average height of about 4,000 m (13,123 ft).

At 6,194m (20,320 ft), _____ is the highest peak in North America, named after the 25th US President, it is sacred to the native Americans, and known as 'Denali' or "The High One". This mountain has not one but two snow-capped summits.

Famous as the _____, the smoke that thunders ('mosi-o-a-tunya') on River Zambezi forms the boundary between Zambia and Zimbabwe in Africa. Its curtain of mist rises 300m and can be seen 40km away.

The amazing rock formation of _____, Turkey, is a series of dazzling white terraces resembling a frozen waterfall which descend down a hillside for 90 m (300ft). The tiers are the result of hot springs bubbling up at the top of the hill, flowing down, cooling and crystallizing. The spring water, which can be as hot as 43°C, has been famous for its curative properties since Roman times.
