1. _____ was the President of the United States, the Commander-in-Chief of the Continental Army during the American revolutionary war and one of the Founding Fathers of the United States.
2. _____ was a King of the Ancient Greek Kingdom of Macedonia, member of the Argead dynasty.
3. _____ also known as Charles the Great or Charles I, was the King of the Franks from 768, the King of Italy from 774 and from 800 the first emperor in western Europe since the collapse of the Western Roman Empire three centuries earlier.
4. _____ was a British politician who was the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom from 1940 to 1945 and again from 1951 to 1955.
5. _____ was a French military and political leader who rose to prominence during the latter stages of the French Revolution and its associated wars in Europe.
6. _____ was an Austria-born German politician and the leader of the Nazi Party. He was the chancellor of Germany from 1933 to 1945 and dictator of Nazi Germany from 1934 to 1945.
7. _____ was the 34th President of the United States from 1953 until 1961. He was a five-star general in the United States Army during world war II and served as supreme commander of the Allied Forces in Europe.
8. _____ was the king of Scotland, famous for beating the English army at the battle of Bannockburn near Stirling in 1314.
9. _____ was a British flag officer, famous for his service in the Royal Navy, particularly during the Napoleonic wars.
10. _____ was the founder and Great Khan of the Mongol Empire, which became the largest contiguous empire in history after his demise. He came to power by uniting many of the nomadic tribes of northeast Asia.
