Learner autonomy is when students take responsibility for their own learning, in terms of what they learn and how they learn it. Students are able to develop an independent and **proactive** approach to their studies.

In university education, learner autonomy is particularly important. Students may have limited classroom time for learning a subject, but they may need to rapidly increase their knowledge and skills. Therefore, it is important for them to continue learning efficiently outside the classroom.

In autonomous learning, it's important for students to have ideas of their own role as a learner. Classroom discussion and conversations with the teacher can help students to understand the essential part that they play in their own success. Autonomous students can learn far more than passive learners. Independent students can address their own individual needs and make progress.

Autonomy involves students having a range of learning strategies which they are able to apply flexibly in different contexts. Teachers can help students to develop learning strategies through learner training in the classroom, and this can take many forms.

In the early stages of a course, it is useful to demonstrate as a class how to use such resources effectively. For example, when reading a text in lessons, students can choose a small number of new words which they are unable to understand from context. Then, they are encouraged to look up the words in an English-English dictionary. Then, they can discuss which one is the correct meaning for that context.

Teachers can **set** students homework tasks such as reading a text of their choice and researching a number of words in an English-English dictionary. Students should be encouraged to think deeply about the process in class. This can help them to transfer skills beyond the classroom and become more autonomous learners.
