



ADVERBS OF DEGREE AND MANNER


• **Adverbs of degree**

not very (X)	<i>Ducks are <b>not very</b> big. (X)</i>
quite (✓)	<i>Sheep are <b>quite</b> big. (✓)</i>
very (✓✓)	<i>Horses are <b>very</b> big. (✓✓)</i>
extremely (✓✓✓)	<i>Bears are <b>extremely</b> big. (✓✓✓)</i>



**Giraffes**

Height: about 5.5 m  
Weight: 500-1200 kg  
Can run: up to 48 km/h



**Lions**

Height: about 1 m  
Weight: 125-190 kg  
Can run: up to 80 km/h

**Squirrels**

Height: 15-27 cm  
Weight: 0.35-0.95 kg  
Can run: 13-16 km/h



*Lions are shorter than giraffes, but squirrels are the shortest of all.*
