

## FUTURE WITH **WILL** AND **BE GOING TO**

Recuerda que "**will**" se utiliza para expresar futuro no planificado o decisiones repentinas, mientras que "**be going to**" se utiliza para expresar futuros planificados o intenciones.

Use **will** for:

- Spontaneous decisions.
- Promises or offers
- Predictions without evidence

Use **be going to** for:

- Plans
- Intentions
- Predictions based on present evidence

### FUTURE SIMPLE WITH "WILL"

Affirmative	Negative	Question
I will work.	I will not work.	Will I work?
You will listen.	You will not listen.	Will you listen?
He/she will stay.	He/she will not stay.	Will he/she stay?
You will phone.	You will not phone.	Will you phone?
They will speak.	They will not speak.	Will they speak?

### FUTURE SIMPLE WITH "BE GOING TO"

AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	INTERROGATIVE
I am going to study	I am not going to study	Am I going to study?
You are going to study	You aren't going to study	Are you going to study?
He/She/It is going to study	He/She/It isn't going to study	Is he/she/it going to study?
We are going to study	We aren't going to study	Are we going to study?
You are going to study	You aren't going to study	Are you going to study?
They are going to study	They aren't going to study	Are they going to study?

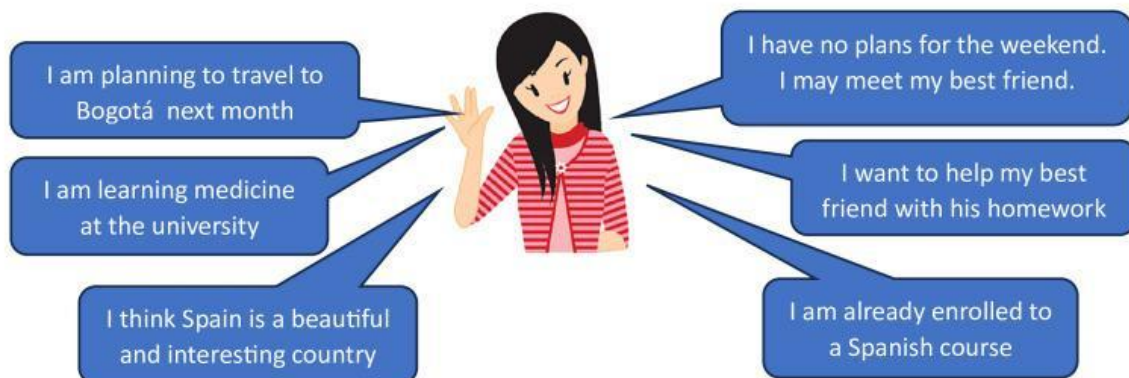
