Section A. Humans universally recognize and create music, from Stone Age tribesmen to modern teenagers. This is puzzling since music isn't essential for survival or reproduction. Unlike language, which helps in organizing, building, and communicating, music seems unnecessary. Yet, scientists are intrigued by its connection to language. Language is seen as vital for understanding human intelligence, while music has been considered a luxury. However, this view is changing.

Section B. Recent neuroscience research shows that music and language might be equally important in understanding humans. Studies suggest that the sounds of music and language are deeply connected. Traditionally, music has been seen as having universal qualities, like the use of the 12-note chromatic scale. This preference has been linked to the mathematical properties of sound. Pythagoras noted that harmony is related to the physical dimensions of objects producing sound.

Section C. However, David Schwartz and colleagues argue that our musical preferences are shaped by the sounds of real life, especially speech, rather than mathematical ratios. They analyzed speech sounds from various languages and found that the frequencies correspond to the chromatic scale. Music, like visual arts, reflects our experience of the natural world. This suggests that our preference for music comes from sounds familiar to us, especially those that resemble human speech. This raises questions about whether music or language came first in evolution. It's unclear, but both seem to come from the same system, influencing our preferences.

Section D. This study also touches on whether animals understand music. Although animals like birds and whales produce sounds, they don't seem to appreciate human music. Laboratory animals show some recognition of human tunes, but this likely reflects general auditory features rather than a musical ability. Animals' "music" would differ from ours, based on their sound environment. To prove animals don't appreciate music like humans, we'd need to see how they respond to music from their own sounds.

Section E. The deep connection between language and music is evident in babies. Sandra Trehub from the University of Toronto notes that mothers use musical speech to soothe and communicate with infants. This speech-song blend puts babies in a trancelike state. This suggests that music might be more necessary than we realize, deeply rooted in our biology just like language.
