Working from home

Five readers share their advice for people working from home.

Carolina

Having worked in an office for years, I found it strange working from home. Going into the office had been like a signal to switch into work mode for me. In fact, when my boss suggested working from home, I was concerned that the boundaries between my work and home life would become less clear. That's why I made a workspace in the corner of my living room with a desk and one of those big office chairs. I've even put a sign up which says 'Office'! It's not the same as going into the office, but I'd recommend that anyone working from home has their own workspace.

Marcus

I started working from home a few weeks ago, but, up to that point, I'd always worked in an office. I'd dreamt of being able to work remotely for ages because it seemed much more convenient. However, I hadn't realised how much I'd miss my teammates and our little chats around the photocopier. Sometimes our manager accused us of wasting time, but we all knew that social contact was essential for working in a team. My advice to anyone working from home would be to stay in touch with your colleagues because you never know when you might need their support or when they might need yours.

Rick

One of the worst things about remote working is that you have to organise your own time. When I worked in an office, it wasn't a problem because we all had the same schedule. However, your day tends to lack structure when you're working from home. For example, you can easily forget to take a break. If you find it difficult to organise your time like me, I'd recommend setting an alarm clock to go off when it's time for a break. When I suggested it to my colleagues, they all laughed, but I know for a fact they've started doing it as well!

Polly

Recently we had a training session about the importance of transitions at work. I'd never heard of them before, but, basically, they're points in the day when things change. We were given the example of the journey to work. It's a transition between home and work which prepares your brain for the day ahead. When you work remotely, you don't have the same transitions, especially if 'going to work' means falling out of bed and switching on your laptop. The trainer suggested doing what we'd normally do on the way to work in order to prepare us for the working day. Now I do the crossword every morning before I start working, which I can't recommend enough.

Melinda

Although I enjoy working from home, I find it really easy to get distracted. At first, the main distraction was my husband. He was always asking me questions while I was working, so in the end I had to ask him to stop disturbing me. However, I was distracting myself as well by checking my social media all the time. That's why I created a separate work account on my browser. Because there aren't any links to social media, I don't end up getting distracted so much. If you're a social media addict like me, you ought to create a separate account as well!
