A food critic is a professional writer who tries food and writes about it. They may also be called a food writer or a restaurant reviewer. Most of the time, food critics go to different restaurants, order a range of dishes, and write about what they ate. There are people who review food for newspapers, magazines, blogs, and websites. But not every job in this field pays well or even pays at all. Food writers who are just starting out might send in unpaid reviews at first just to get a byline and build up their list of published works. Some food critics get their start by posting about their food and dining experiences on social media.

Top food writers can try new foods all over the world. Some of these experts have their own shows on TV. Food experts who do well can also put their work in books. This is a highly **coveted** career with a limited number of paid openings. Those who want this job need to be willing to put in a lot of hard work and time.

Here are the salary ranges for each job:

- Journalist: \$36 per hour
- Reporter: \$41,869 per year
- Staff writers: \$38,716 per year
- Content writers: \$17.54 per hour
- Total salaries: from \$7.25 to \$74.45 per hour

Because this is such a small field, there isn't much information about how much food writers make. But there is information for journalists, reporters, staff writers, and content writers, whose jobs are similar to

those of food reviews. Many food reviewers only write about food part of the time. When they're not reviewing restaurants, they work as full-time journalists or reporters who cover other topics.

**Stream Video Games:** Maybe your parents won't lecture you about how many video games you're consuming when you show them your paycheck for it. Popular platforms like YouTube or Twitch will allow you to stream your video gaming session to a live audience. If you build a solid following of subscribers,

you can earn money for it and also become more known in the gaming community, especially Facebook site, which could create other opportunities.

**Become a Freelancer:** If you have started a blog or honed skills like writing, digital animation, graphics design, photography, calligraphy or drawing, you can likely use it to earn money as a **freelancer**. Fiverr is an online freelance marketplace where you can sign up and create a profile to sell your services to people from all over the world who need them. As long as you are at least 13 years old, you can use Fiverr to promote your freelance services.

**Resell Vintage Clothing and Accessories:** To make this gig work, you'll need to spend some time visiting thrift stores and places like Goodwill or the Salvation Army to find vintage clothing and accessories you can resell for a profit. Consider asking elderly relatives if they would be willing to part with some of their vintage items to help you get started. Good places to sell vintage clothing and accessories are D-Pop, Facebook Marketplace or Etsy.

However, if you opt for the traditional route to make money, put your best foot forward when filling out job applications and attending interviews to make a shining first impression. And once you have a job, do your very best so that your supervisor will be willing to promote you or give you a good reference when you move on to another job.
