Note about the story

Malorie Blackman was born in London. She writes books for children and young adults, and she also writes for television. *Pig-Heart Boy* was first shown on television in 2000 and she has also written for *Doctor Who*.

In *Pig-Heart Boy*, 13-year-old Cameron Kelsey has a problem with his heart and needs to have a heart **transplant***. A transplant is when doctors take a heart, or another **organ**, from one person's body and put it inside another person. There are not enough **human** hearts, so doctors want to use a pig's heart to help Cameron. But some **animal rights** groups are very angry about doctors using animals in this way.

Pig-Heart Boy looks at how different people feel about transplants, the hard work of doctors and if it is right to use an animal organ to save a person's life.
