- * "**As soon as**" is used to indicate that one event happens immediately after another.
- * "**By the time**" is used to indicate that one event happens before another, but not immediately before.
- * "**During**" is used to indicate that something happens while another event is taking place.
- * "**Until**" is used to indicate that something happens up to a certain point in time.
- * "**While**" is used to indicate that two events are happening at the same time.
- * "**Meanwhile**" is used to indicate that something is happening at the same time as another event, but in a different place or situation.
