## Read the story.

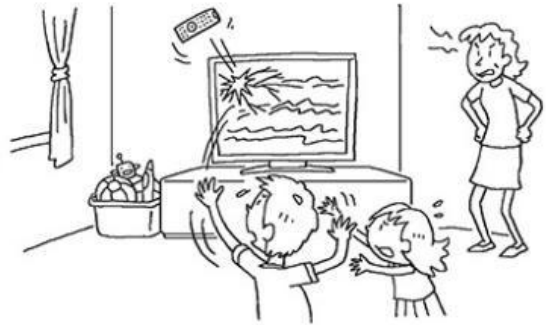
It was the start of the school holidays. Maisy and Tom were arguing.
