Kenya has a spectacular natural diversity, from tropical forests and deserts to mountains and **savannahs**. There are many activities on offer to suit your tastes, preferences and budget.

The country is divided from north to south by the Great Rift Valley, which is wide and shallow in the north, and deeper and surrounded cliffs further south. The north is a region of deserts where travellers can go on camel safaris. West of the valley, savanna **plains** descend to the sandy **shores** of Lake Victoria.

The plains of the southern savannahs are the most popular regions for safari trips. Kenya's national parks and **game reserves** are a paradise for wildlife enthusiasts who want to see the Big Five: leopard, lion, elephant, rhino and buffalo.

The capital, Nairobi, is located in the south on a 1,500m high plateau. Mount Kenya (Kirinyaga), 150km north to northeast of the capital, is Africa's second highest mountain.

Mombasa, Kenya's second largest city, is in the southwest next to the Indian Ocean. The tropical **coastline** with its palm-lined beaches is a popular attraction for visitors who want to sunbathe and **explore** the underwater life of the **coral reefs** along the clear blue Indian Ocean.
