Be careful!

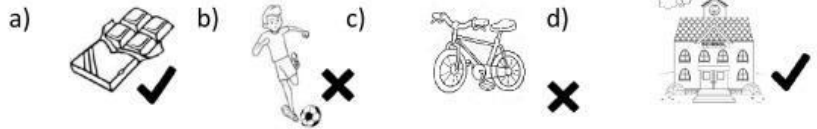
For negatives add 'don't' or 'doesn't'.
