




Scammers on the Internet


Scammers are people who try to trick others on the internet. They often send fake emails or messages to make people believe they are from a trusted company, like a bank or an online store. These messages might ask for personal information, such as passwords, credit card numbers, or bank details. Double-check email addresses, and if something looks suspicious, don't click on any links or respond to the message. It's better to ask for help from someone you trust if you are not sure.


