

Crime

People who break the law are called delinquents. When people commit crimes, it is called delinquency. If you commit a crime, you will be punished. Punishments can include paying a fine or going to jail.

If you are guilty of a serious crime, you could go to jail for a very long time or even get a life sentence. Some common crimes are theft, which is stealing something, and murder, which is killing someone. A person who steals is called a thief, and a person who murders is called a murderer.

Not everyone who is suspected of a crime is guilty. Sometimes, people are innocent. Other crimes include pickpocketing, which is stealing from people's pockets, and drunk driving, which is driving a car after drinking alcohol. A person who steals from pockets is a pickpocket, and a person who drives drunk is a drunk driver.
