Dinosaurs were reptiles that existed throughout the Mesozoic Era, sometimes termed the Age of Reptiles, a time in Earth's history. Maybe the weather got too cold for the dinosaurs, what with their lack of fur and feathers and their size that prevented them from hibernating. Species with better defense mechanisms, including birds and mammals, fared better.

Cooking classes will be a school requirement for English high school students. In an effort to combat the rising obesity epidemic in the nation, the plan is to promote nutritious eating. There is concern that parents are increasingly relying on pre-prepared convenience foods, which could lead to a decline in basic cooking and food preparation abilities.

English schools used to include cooking classes, even though they catered mostly to female students. Over the past few decades, school lunch programs have increasingly **shrunk** in importance.
