1. A mediator can help solve a conflict by listening to both sides and helping them understand each other. For example, if two friends are arguing over a toy, a mediator could help them take turns and find a fair solution.
2. I saw a conflict happen on the playground when two kids wanted to use the swing at the same time. The agents were the two kids who wanted the swing. The process was tense at first, with both kids arguing, but then they calmed down and decided to take turns.
