- And - used to connect two similar or related ideas.
 - Example: I like tea and coffee.
- But - It's used to introduce a contrast or exception to the previous idea.
 - Example: I want to go out but it's raining.
- Or - It's used to present alternatives or choices.
 - Example: Do you want tea or coffee?
- So - It's used to indicate a consequence or result.
 - Example: It's getting late so we should go home.
