

THERE IS / THERE ARE

A Walk in the Park

Use *There is* and *There are* to talk about things that you can see or that exist.

Statements	Questions
There is a beautiful park in Springfield. There isn't a park in Livingston.	Is there a beautiful park in Springfield? Yes, there is .
There are people in the park. There aren't any ducks in the park.	Are there any ducks in the park? No, there aren't .

Use *any* with negative statements or with questions that use plurals or uncountable nouns.
