- * While - It's used to indicate two actions happening simultaneously.

- * Example: I studied for my exam while listening to music.

- * When - It's used to indicate a specific time or occasion.

- * Example:

- * When I went to Tikal, I learned about Mayan Culture

- * However - It's used to introduce a contrast or contradiction to the previous idea.

- * Example: She is very talented; however, she lacks confidence.

- * Although - It's used to introduce a concession or contrast to the previous idea.

- * Example: Although it was raining, we decided to go for a walk.
