

Present perfect tense (3)

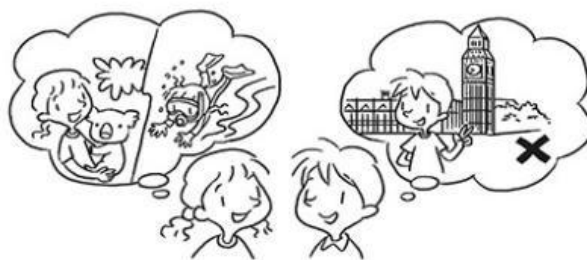
Leon: Have you **ever** been to Australia, Alice?

Alice: Yes, I have.

Leon: **How many times** have you been there?

Alice: I've been there twice. Have you **ever** been to the UK?

Leon: No, I haven't. / No, I've never been to the UK.



We can use the **present perfect tense** to talk about an experience up to the present moment.
We do not say exactly when it happened.

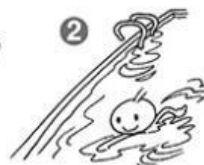

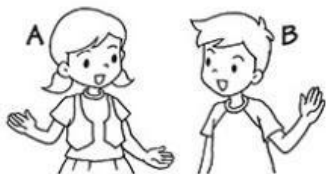
