

ACCEPT-ACCEPTED-ACCEPTED



- to take something that someone offers you

- to say that something is true, often something bad

- to admit that you caused something bad that happened

Examples:

She **accepted** the proposal.
They won't **accept** advice from anyone.

She refuses to **accept that** she made a mistake.

I **accept** full responsibility for the accident.

ACHIEVE—ACHIEVED—ACHIEVED



- to succeed in doing something difficult



- to succeed in doing

Examples:

I finally **achieved** my goal of winning the competition.

Achieving your goals
What can be **achieved** by doing that?

ACT-ACTED-ACTED



- to do something to stop a problem

- to behave in a particular way, usually a bad way

- to perform in a play or movie

Examples:

We have to **act** now to stop the spread of this disease.

Stop **acting** like a child!

Tom Cruise **acted** in the last movie: Mission Impossible 7.

ADD-ADDED-ADDED



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- to put something together with something else, making the whole thing bigger

- to put two or more numbers together to get a total

- to say another thing

Examples:

Mix the sugar and butter, then **add** the eggs.
Do you have anything to **add to** the list?

Don't forget to **add** the cost of postage.

She said she was there for her
but **added that** she wanted to help her.

ADMIRE-ADMIRED-ADMIRED



- to like something or to like and respect someone for the good qualities that he, she, or it has



- to look at something or someone and think that he, she, or it is attractive

Examples:

We admire him for being so efficient and honest.

She really admired her classmate.
