<b>dentist</b> (n) /'dentɪst/	a person that treats people's teeth as a job	I don't like visiting the <b>dentist</b> .
<b>engineer</b> (n) /endʒɪ'nɪr/	a person whose job is to design and build engines, machines, bridges and many others	They sent an <b>engineer</b> to check the bridge before it collapsed.
<b>vlogger</b> (n) /'vlɑ:gər/	a person who creates a video with their ideas or opinions	A travel <b>vlogger</b> can tell us all about countries in the world.
<b>musician</b> (n) /'mju:zɪn/	a person who writes music as a job	My mom really glad to see me grow up as a <b>musician</b> .
<b>flight attendant</b> (n) /'flaɪt ə,tendənt/	a person who serves airplane passengers	Rita became a <b>flight attendant</b> because she loved to travel.
<b>game designer</b> (n) /'geɪm dɪ'zɑ:nər/	a person who designs smartphone or computer games	Shane wants to attend college to become a <b>game designer</b> .
<b>veterinarian</b> (n) /'vetərɪ'nɪəriən/ also <b>vet</b>	a person skilled in the medical care of animals	If your cat becomes ill, speak with a <b>veterinarian</b> .
<b>journalist</b> (n) /'dʒɜ:nəlɪst/	a person who writes news reports for newspapers, magazines, television or radio	She has a talent for essay writing and plans to work as a <b>journalist</b> .

### Grammar

#### Possessive Pronouns

*Mine, his, hers, theirs* and *ours* are **Possessive Pronouns**. We use them to avoid repetition in writing and speaking.

This book is **my** book, not **your** book.

This book is **mine**, not **yours**.

#### Possessive Adjectives

my      your      our      their      his      her      its

#### Possessive Pronouns

mine      yours      ours      theirs      his      hers      its

#### NOTE

We do not use an apostrophe (') for a possessive pronoun.

Is that **yours**?                      **NOT** Is that **your's**?

We can use **of** before a possessive pronoun.

That is Steve, a friend **of mine**.
