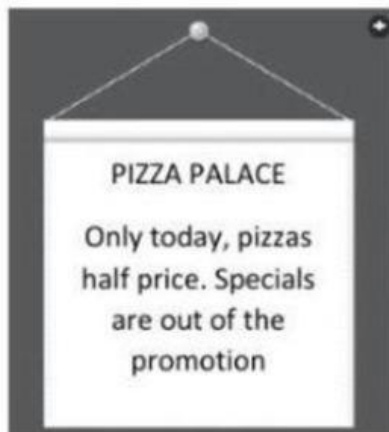

(subject + will + have + past participle)

An **action** that will happen before **another action** in the future

- He by the time he leaves the house. (prepare)
- His wife dinner by the time he returns. (make)
- I my book before we leave tonight. (finish)
