

TOO vs ENOUGH

TOO : means more than what is needed (**DEMASIADO**)

TOO+ Adjective/ Adverb

It's **too** hot to wear that coat (adjective)

I was driving **too** fast (adverb)

ENOUGH: means sufficient (**SUFICIENTE**)

- Adjective / Adverb + ENOUGH

He isn't **old enough** to watch this program (Adjective)

We're not walking **quickly enough** (adverb)

- ENOUGH + Noun

We haven't got **enough money** to buy this computer (Noun)
