

Activity Title: "Mystery of the Missing Backpack!"

Instructions:

Read the following story and answer the questions that follow. Pay attention to subject and object pronouns!

Story:

Yesterday, **Tom** went to school, but he forgot something important—his backpack! He was worried all day. When **he** got home, he asked **his** sister, Lucy, "Did you see my backpack?" Lucy smiled and said, "No, I didn't. But maybe Dad knows where it is."

Tom called **his** dad and asked, "Did you take my backpack by accident?" **His** dad laughed, "No, I didn't take it, but I found it in the car." Tom was so happy. "Can you bring it home?" he asked. "Of course, I'll bring it," said Dad. When **Tom** got **his** backpack, he thanked both his sister and his dad.

Part 1: True or False (5 minutes)

Read each statement and decide if it's true or false.

1. **Tom** lost **his** lunch at school.
2. Lucy said that she saw Tom's backpack.
3. **Tom's dad** found the backpack in the school.
4. **Tom** thanked his sister and his dad.
5. Lucy brought the backpack home.

Part 2: Multiple Choice (5 minutes)

Choose the correct pronoun to complete the sentences.

2. Tom asked Lucy if (**he/she**) saw his backpack.
3. Dad said, "**(I/You)** found your backpack in the car."
4. Tom thanked (**him/her**) and his dad.
5. (**He/She**) took the backpack home for Tom.

Part 3: Open-Ended Questions (10 minutes)

Write your answers in complete sentences. Use the correct subject and object pronouns.

1. Who lost **his** backpack?
2. Who did Tom ask about **his** backpack?
3. Where did Tom's dad find **it**?
4. What did Tom say to his dad when **he** got his backpack back?
5. How did Tom feel when **he** found out where his backpack was?

Imagine you're Tom. Write a sentence explaining how you would ask a friend for help using subject and object pronouns.
