

## Talking About Completed Actions with a Connection to the Present

We use the Present Perfect to talk about actions or events that happened at an unspecified time in the past but have a connection to the present.

*Example: "I have broken my leg."*

*(This means you broke your leg at some time in the past and it is still broken today.)*



## TALKING ABOUT EXPERIENCES

We use it to talk about experiences in our life.

*Example: "I have been to Berlin."*

*(This means you visited Berlin at some point in your life, but you're not specifying when.)*

## Talking About Actions That Started in the Past and Continue into the Present

We also use it to talk about actions that began in the past and are still relevant or ongoing in the present.

*Example: "He has lived in this city for five years."*

*(He moved to the city five years ago, and he still lives there.)*

Formula to make future perfect tense



- S + has/have + Past Participle
- **She has baked the cake.**



- S + has/have +not + Past Participle
- **She has not baked the cake.**



- Has/have + S + Past Participle + ?
- **Has she baked the cake?**

## EXAMPLES

**To show the work that is recently completed.**

She has just baked the cake.

**For a specific moment of time.**

I have lived in this city since 2011.

**How long actions continued?**

He has had a pup for two years

**To express the time period**

They have been at duty for 8 hours.

**To describe the finished or completed actions.**

He has taken the exam today.

**Announcement in media**

The corona-virus has damaged the economy of the world.
